The SLC Group provides supported living and floating support services for adults and young people who are blind or partially sighted. This can include a dual diagnosis.

By working closely with local multi-disciplinary teams, and with high quality specific training, we support individuals to lead independent and fulfilling lives in their community.

Our services are bespoke to each individual and include people using their own budget.

Our Support

Our supported living and floating support services are designed to help individuals who are blind or partially sighted to live independently in their own home or tenancy.

We have found the key to providing successful care and support to individuals who are blind or partially sighted is to create a flexible, and individualised supported living package which meets assessed needs and delivers outcomes.

We can work with individuals at every stage including; assessing needs, identifying individual service requirements, signposting to other agencies and providing high quality support.

Support can range from several hours per week in our floating support services to up to 24 hours a day in our supported living services.

My Story

When Andrew Johnson (Sparky as he likes to be known) was involved in a road traffic accident six years ago he completely lost his sight and is now supported by SLC Paragon to live in his own flat.

After his accident Sparky moved into a residential home where he lived for over two years. This type of set up was all wrong for Sparky, he explains why: "I hated living in the residential service. I found it really hard - it was like being in a box. That's when I knew something had to change."

Sparky moved into his own flat in April 2006 with support from SLC. His main aim was to re-build his life skills and regain his independence.

"It changed my life." Says Sparky. "One of the best things was being able to cook for myself again - being in the residential home I really missed making my own meals".

Andrew worked as a chef for many years and cooking is a big passion of his.

"At first staff would assist me with preparing and making meals but now I only need their help with certain things."

Staff support Sparky in many different ways, depending on what he wants to do. "Staff chat with me, support me when I go out in the community, when I need help in the flat or to give me advice. They are very good at their jobs and always support me when I want them to – whatever I need help or support with they are there."
